Fasting

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It seems that a fast is done to have survival, salvation, strength for activities, guide from God, and worship. The king of Nineveh and his people took the fast in order to survive and salvation. Through Jonah, God stated the city of Nineveh should be overthrown. The king and the people did seriously the fast. They eat and drink nothing for they hoped that God would forgive their sins and turned away from his fierce anger. The result was that God did not punish the city. In the era of Esther, Jews fasted for their survival (Est. 4 : 3). Then, Esther and Mordecai asked the Jews to do fast, to confirm the day of Purim, after they won over Haman, their enemy (Est. 9 : 31). Certain prophets and teachers in the early church ministered with fasting and prayer to the Lord. They did fast and prayer for the Lord work needs (Acts 13 : 1-3).

Perhaps fast was done for the first time in the era of David (Ps. 35 : 13), or in the era between David and Moses. Moses did neither eat bread nor drink water for forty days and forty nights on the Mt Sinai when he was there with the Lord (Ex. 34 : 28). Moses was not stated fast at the time. Jesus did not eat for forty days and forty nights. However, it is clearly stated that Jesus did fast at the time (Matt. 4 : 2 and Luke 4 : 2). It is possible that fast was done by both Jews and other than Jews in the era of The Old and New Testament, too, as people of Nineveh did.

Jesus fasted in order to strengthen the relationship with the Father. He did it forty days and forty nights. After doing it, he was tempted by the devil. Jesus prayed and fasted to heal sick

people. However, he did not say that each the sick must be healed by prayer and fast. To heal deafness, the gospel of Matthew indicates that it should be done by prayer and fast. Fast and prayer are needed to heal a certain sickness (Matt. 17:21). It seems that prayer and fast were used by the early Christian to strengthen their faith and to heal the sick. Fast is not a requirement to become a good Christian, but it is strongly recommended to do it.

The scripture does not indicate clearly about how to do the fast. Jesus did it as long as forty days and forty nights. It is difficult for everyone to fast as Jesus did. Everyone could fast as long as he/she can. It could be done as long as : 1) No more than forty days and forty nights; 2) Between a day and forty days and nights; and 3) A day or a night. Fast could be done with no eat at all (Luke 4 : 2). The gospel of Matthew does not indicate clearly about how Jesus took the fast. It seems indirectly that he took it without eating only. And when the tempter came to him, he said, if thou be the Son of God, Command that these stones be made bread (Mat. 4 : 3). The tempter did not say anything about water. However, it could be done with no eat, nor drink. It is a good idea to fast, according to the gospel of Luke, to fast as Jesus did; that is, not eat only. Fast could be done for needs: healing, travel. During fasting, it should not be known by others. Common fast could be done before winter.

In my opinion, a Christian, who is walking regularly his/her faith as a Christian in either day and/or night, has done a fast. For example, after taking dinner at 8 p.m., he/she does not eat anymore until at 8 a.m., it could be stated that he/she has done fast a night and a part of a day. According to my habit, I finish my dinner around 7 p.m. I do not eat anything after dinner, except I am not in good shape. I drink water around 7 a.m. in the morning, and then around an hour later, around 8 a.m., I take breakfast. I do self-denial during the night. I do it every night. If I cannot sleep at all, I pray to God each hour and is finished with the Lord's Prayer at 4 a.m. This

is a full night fasting and between two and three hours fasting in day in Indonesia time. Thus, I

do fast every day. Darius, the king of Medes and Persians, did a night fasting (Dan. 6:18). It is

not easy to do a fast in the night. We face the terror by the night, particularly in a rural or isolated

area. I encourage doing fast in a day and/or a night. Psalm 91: 1, 2, and 5. 1 He that dwelleth in

the secret place of the most high shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

2 I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him I will trust.

5 Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by the night; nor for the arrow that flieth by the day;

Verses that related to fasting
